AN ACT to Amend the Retiring Allowances

(Legislative Service) Act. [1<sup>st</sup> day of March, 2005]

BE IT ENACTED by The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Representatives 

1. This Act may be cited as the Retiring Allowances (Legislative Short title. Service) (Amendment) Act, 2013, and shall be read and construed construction as one with the Retiring Allowances (Legislative Service) Act mencement. (hereinafter referred to as the principal Act), and all amendments thereto, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of March, 2005.

Amendment of section 6 of principal Act. 2. Section 6 of the principal Act is amended—

- (a) in subsection (1) (a), by—
  - (i) deleting the word "and" at the end of subparagraph (iv) and substituting therefor the word "or"; and
  - (ii) inserting next after sub-paragraph (iv), the following as sub-paragraph (v)—
    - " (v) has served as a legislator for periods which together with that person's service as a councillor, amount in the aggregate to not less than eleven years; and"; and
- (b) in subsection (2), by-
  - (i) deleting the full stop appearing at the end of paragraph (d) and substituting therefor a semicolon; and
  - (ii) inserting next after paragraph (d) the following as paragraph (e)—
    - "(e) "councillor" has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 (1) of the Retiring Allowances (Parish Councillors) Act.".
