The Alternative Secondary Transitional Education Programme (ASTEP)

INTRODUCTION

Members are being asked to note the update on the Alternative Secondary Transitional Education Programme (ASTEP).

BACKGROUND

The Alternative Secondary Transitional Education Programme (ASTEP) was designed as a two year transitional programme to provide a safety net for children who, at the end of the primary level, did not possess the prerequisite literacy skills and competencies to successfully access traditional secondary education. The delivery of ASTEP commenced in September 2011.

The Programme now consists of three (3) main groups - cohort one which commenced September 2011, cohort two in 2012 and cohort three in 2013. A total of eight thousand and eight (8,008) students are currently enrolled in the Programme, with an anticipated two thousand (2000) to be enrolled in September 2014.

STATUS

The following provides an update on the status of the cohorts;

- Cohort 1 has already completed two years in the Programme and has started a special modified high school programme.
- Cohort 2 is now in the second year of the Progamme and will be assessed later in
 this school year in an effort to determine the sudents' readiness for entry into the
 regular secondary school system. Based on their performance, some will
 transition to secondary level schools while the others will be placed in a special
 educational programme, where their individual needs will be assessed and catered
 to.
- As of September 2014, a new intake will be assigned to the Programme, making a total of four (4) groups now addressed by this Programme.
- There are currently one hundred and forty one (141) ASTEP Schools across the six regions, moving from an initial total of one hundred and sixty three (163) schools. The reduction of schools was achieved through the removal of most primary schools from the programme, with the students being relocated to All-Age and Primary and Junior High Schools in proximity. No increase is expected in the current number of schools, as other primary schools that will be removed from the programme will be replaced by the addition of All-Age or Primary and Junior High Schools to accommodate the students.

 One hundred and thirty nine (139) Centre Coordinators are contracted to the Programme representing the total number of contract staff at this time. It is possible that this number may decrease with the shifting of centres from primary schools to All -Age and Junior High Schools with excess teachers on staff. These Teachers would be expected to handle the incoming students.

In preparing the budget, the four (4) cohorts have been considered and appropriate funds allocated to address the needs of the students. **Table 1** provides an estimate of funds allocated to each cohort assigned to each group.
