## Social Intervention Report

(September 1, 2017- June 5, 2019)

This Honourable House is being requested to note that subsequent to the enactment of the Law Reform (Zones of Special Operations) (Special Security and Community Development Measures) Act, the Prime Minister on the advice of the National Security Council, declared Mount Salem as the first Zone of Special Operation (ZOSO) under the legislation, The Law Reform (Zones of Special Operations) (Special Security and Community Development Measures) Act, 2017 on September 1, 2017.

Since the declaration of Mount Salem as a zone, the state through the Social Intervention Committee has coordinated the delivery of social services to the community. The interventions are guided by a Social Intervention development framework approved by Cabinet and which serves as a developmental roadmap comprising seven development areas which focus on: Physical Environment, Land Tenure, Community Safety, Human and Community Development and Employment, Business and Economic Development, Spiritual and Faith Based Intervention and Leadership.

The Social Interventions have intensified since the transition to the Build Phase in February 2018. The Activities are guided by the following theoretical approach:

- 1. Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED)
- 2. Crime Prevention through Social Development (CPTSD)

## NEW INTERVENTIONS SINCE REPORT ON APRIL 2019 IN MOUNT SALEM

During the review period April to June 2019, the social transformation initiatives being implemented in the Mount Salem ZOSO continued in earnest. To date the community has seen interventions valued in excess of J\$150M successfully executed in the space. Currently the focus is on the following developments:

- 1. The Mount Salem Primary and Infant School Design works and pre-tender stage to be funded by the JSIF.
- 2. Mount Salem Police Station and Health Centre JSIF doing appraisal, towards developing a potential project to rehabilitate both facilitates. Further update and decisions to be finalized during the next quarter June to August 2019.

3. Sustaining efforts at preserving the peace and safety, with the Community CDC actively working with the police. Of note are efforts to rehabilitate and forge an alternative pathway among a group of youth that were suspected violence producers.
