### Social Intervention Report

(September 1, 2017- July 17, 2019)

This Honourable House is being requested to note that subsequent to the enactment of the Law Reform (Zones of Special Operations) (Special Security and Community Development Measures) Act, the Prime Minister on the advice of the National Security Council, declared Mount Salem as the first Zone of Special Operation (ZOSO) under the legislation, The Law Reform (Zones of Special Operations) (Special Security and Community Development Measures) Act, 2017 on September 1, 2017.

Since the declaration of Mount Salem as a zone, the state through the Social Intervention Committee has coordinated the delivery of social services to the community. The interventions are guided by a Social Intervention development framework approved by Cabinet and which serves as a developmental roadmap comprising seven development areas which focus on: Physical Environment, Land Tenure, Community Safety, Human and Community Development and Employment, Business and Economic Development, Spiritual and Faith Based Intervention and Leadership.

The Social Interventions have intensified since the transition to the Build Phase in February 2018. The Activities are guided by the following theoretical approach:

- 1. Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED)
- 2. Crime Prevention through Social Development (CPTSD)

### NEW INTERVENTIONS SINCE REPORT ON JUNE 2019 IN MOUNT SALEM

During the current review period, which concluded on July 17, 2019, the Mount Salem ZOSO saw a limited number of new activities with respect to Social Intervention. The activities during the period were largely driven by the Community Development Committee (CDC) and included:

- 1. Community spelling competition, for children 6-12 yrs. from the respective avenues competing among each other.
- 2. Community football league

The other activity of note is the NWA doing rehabilitation of some prior roads that were done in the Zone including the Mount Salem main road, Piggot Street and Crawford Street. This intervention was costed at approximately J\$19Million.

The recent activities have cumulatively increased the overall value of projects executed in the community to now in excess of J\$ 170M. Since the last update, work has continued with respect to the following projects:

- 1. The Mount Salem Primary and Infant School Design works completed, and pre-tender activities under development. Project to be funded by the JSIF.
- 2. Mount Salem Police Station and Health Centre Appraisals completed, and projects scoped for funding approval.
