### **CABINET AGENDA ISSUES - 14 OCTOBER 2019**

The House is asked to note the following matters which were considered by the Cabinet at its meeting held on 14 October 2019:

- 1. Contracts;
- 2. Legislation;
- 3. Annual Reports;

Each matter shall be elaborated on in turn.

#### 1. Contracts

(i) Construction of the Rural Agricultural Development Authority's Hanover Parish Office Cabinet approved the award of a contract in the amount of \$108,941,194.00 to Morris Hill Limited for the construction of a single-storey office building to house the Hanover Parish Office of the Rural Agricultural Development Authority (RADA) in Haughton Court, Hanover.

The Hanover Parish Office for RADA currently operates from two separate locations which has become logistically challenging and, as such, one appropriate office is to be constructed.

## (ii) Procurement of Viral Load Tests, Reagents and Supplies

Cabinet approved the award of a contract in the amount of US\$959,088.00, excluding General Consumption Tax, to LASCO Distributors Limited, for the supply of viral load tests, reagents and supplies to the National Public Health Laboratory.

The supplies being procured are integral in the detection, monitoring and treatment of the HIV/AIDS virus by the HIV/STI/Tb unit of the Ministry of Health and Wellness.

(iii) Renovations of Existing Buildings at 6 Saxthorpe Avenue, Constant Spring, St. Andrew to House the Transformation Implementation Projects and the Human Resource Management and Internal Audit Shared Services

Cabinet approved the award of a cohtract in the amount of \$84,845,233.29 to N.F. Barnes Construction and Equipment Company Limited, for the renovation of existing buildings located at 6 Saxthorpe Avenue, Kingston 8.

To operationalise the Government's policy of shared corporate services, the location at Saxthorpe Avenue is being renovated to house the relevant staff and equipment.

## (iv) Modernisation and Upgrade of Elevators at the Bank of Jamaica

Cabinet approved the award of a contract in the amount of US\$1,300,106.00 to Essex Elevator Company Inc. to carry out modernisation and upgrading of the Bank of Jamaica's elevators.

The current elevators have outlived their useful life and have been experiencing frequent malfunctions that have negatively impacted the operations of the Bank.

## (v) Provision of Foreign Exchange Trading Platform

Cabinet approved the award of a contract in the amount of US\$987,000.00 to Montran Corporation for the provision of a foreign exchange trading platform to the Bank of Jamaica.

The trading platform will support and coordinate settlement of large value foreign exchange transactions to achieve payment-versus-payment (PVP), through the Real Time Gross Settlement (RTGS) system.

## (vi) Contract Addendum (Number 5) Management of the Jamaica Business Fund

Cabinet approved a fifth variation in the amount of US\$443,589.05 to a contract originally awarded to PATICIP GmbH, for the implementation of a fourth call for proposals and its attendant matching grants projects, under the Jamaica Business Fund for micro, small and medium enterprises development.

The main objective of the Jamaica Business Fund is to strengthen private business in Jamaica through the development of commercially viable value chains that can generate direct employment, increased productivity and other linkage benefits.

(iii) The United Nations Security Council Resolutions Implementation (Amendment) Act, 2019

Cabinet approved the tabling of the Bill entitled "The United Nations Security Council Resolutions Implementation (Amendment) Act, 2019" in the Houses of Parliament.

The Bill seeks to address deficiencies identified in the 2015 Mutual Evaluation Report conducted by the Caribbean Financial Action Task Force.

## 5. Response to the Current Dengue Outbreak

Cabinet considered a report from the Ministry of Health and Wellness in connection with the response of the Ministry to the current Dengue outbreak.

The report reminded that Dengue was a common mosquito-borne disease with an estimated 50 million to 100 million cases occurring globally each year. In Jamaica, there had been continuous local transmission since 1977 with outbreaks occurring every two to four years over the past decade, with the most recent outbreak being in January 2019. Though there had been a curtailing in the burden of the disease following the interventions by the Ministry of Health and Wellness, the reduction in the number of cases had not been sustained below the epidemic threshold.

The report informed that, on 3 January 2019, the Ministry of Health and Wellness had declared that Jamaica was currently experiencing a Dengue outbreak; there had been a general decline in the cases reported monthly since the start of 2019 up to June; as at 28 August 2019, there were 4,409 suspected, presumed or confirmed cases; and the annual peak transmission season for Dengue was during the rainy season between the months of August to December.

The report also provided a breakdown of the suspected, presumed or confirmed cases for Jamaica for the years 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019 (year-to-date); the response of the Ministry of Health and Wellness; and the financial considerations.

The Honourable House is asked to note the foregoing.
