# The Law Reform (Zones of Special Operations) Special Security and Community Development Measures

## Social Intervention Report

(as at January 31, 2020)

This Honourable House is being requested to note that after the enactment of the Law Reform (Zones of Special Operations) (Special Security and Community Development Measures) Act, the Prime Minister on the advice of the National Security Council, declared the Denham Town Community as the second Zone of Special Operations (ZOSO).

The Zones of Special Operations (ZOSO) combine a robust security approach led by the Jamaica Constabulary Force and Jamaica Defence Force, and a Social Intervention Component (SIC) that coordinates and implements social development measures by the various agencies, NGOs and the private sector.

The Social Intervention Committee (SIC) is guided by a framework comprising the following development areas:

- Physical Environment;
- Land Tenure, Community Safety;
- Human and Community Development and Employment;
- Business and Economic Development; Spiritual and
- Faith Based Intervention and Leadership.

The Zone has been in the 'Build Phase' since March 2018. Since the ZOSO was declared in Denham Town, over twenty-two (22) targeted interventions have been completed, benefitting over 2,500 residents directly and over 8,000 residents indirectly. These include health services, infrastructure upgrade, education-based interventions, youth development, behavior modification and entrepreneurship.

Significant works to improve the community infrastructure are ongoing with respect to the transformation of the physical environment, including the expansion of the solid waste management

programme and improvement of the water and sewage infrastructure. These are scheduled to be completed by March 2020.
