1	Fatal Shooting Shooting Injury	Garfield McToggart DB	On Thursday, June 14, 2018 at about 12:40 a.m. Constables were on patrol in a marked service vehicle with registration FO28 along Drax Hall main road, St. Ann. It is alleged that the officers heard a transmission over the radio from the Highway Patrol unit, with registration number F0031, in relation to a vehicle that refused to stop. The officers responded and upon reaching close to the roundabout in the vicinity of the Marcus Gravey High School, they noticed that the aforementioned vehicle was stopped by an OST unit. A grey Nissan Note with registration 1276GX which was travelling behind the car the OST unit had stopped sped off. Constables chased the grey Nissan Note in the marked service vehicle. Upon reaching the Boot Gas Station, the police team heard loud explosions coming from the direction of the Nissan Note motorcar. They also heard additional explosions when the said grey Nissan motorcar reached the gate of Jewel's hotel. The grey Nissan Note drove around the roundabout in Mammee Bay and into the Greenwich Acres Housing Scheme. The police officers heard more explosions coming from the direction of the said motorcar and Constable discharged two (2) rounds from his Glock service pistol into the air. The grey Nissan Note then travelled into the Steer Town community where it ran off the road and crashed in a gully. Two men ran from the grey Nissan Note and fired in the direction of the police. Constables returned fire in the direction of the men. One man escaped and one man was seen with body partially in the vehicle was seen suffering from gunshot wounds and clutching a Smith & Wesson 9mm pistol bearing serial number A842453. He was rushed to the St. Ann's Bay Hospital where he was pronounced dead. A man identified as DB was found by the police in Drax Hall, St. Ann suffering from a gunshot wound to his right thigh. He was taken to the St. Ann's Bay Public Hospital for treatment.	The Commission respectfully recommends that: a) No criminal charges be laid or disciplinary action be taken in relation to the fatal shooting of Garfield McToggart and shooting injury of DB. b) The file be forwarded to the Special Coroner. 2	Fatal Shooting	Marlon Hanson	On Friday, May 18, 2012 a party of police personnel assigned to the May Pen OST led by Corporal and three other officers were responding to information received that men armed with guns were seen in the area firing shots and threatening to set houses on fire. The action of these men is said to be in retaliation for the murder of a Merrick Richards which occurred in the area on May 17, 2012. The police team travelled in two units namely, OST 1 and 2. It is further reported that on their arrival in the area, three men were seen. They were all armed with guns and on the approach of the police; the men opened fire and ran. The police pursued them and on reaching the top of the hill, they received signal that two of the men went into a house nearby. The police headed towards a house and reportedly saw two men coming from the back door. It is alleged that one of the men opened fire on Corporal. He returned fire and the man was hit, the other man ran to a board house nearby. The man who was shot by Corporal reportedly fell to a corner of the house and a 1.38 ROSI revolver serial #M51730 containing three live rounds and three spent shells were allegedly taken from him. He was taken to the May Pen Hospital where he was pronounced dead. The man was identified as Marlon Hanson.	The Commission respectfully recommends that: a) No criminal charges be laid or disciplinary action be taken in relation to the fatal shooting of Marlon Hanson. b) The file be forwarded to the Special Coroner. 3	Fatal Shooting	Jermaine Brown	On Thursday, April 9, 2015 at about 12:05 p.m. Constables of the Old Harbour Police Station were travelling in an unmarked police car behind a public passenger minibus along the Old Harbour Main Road when the bus stopped in the vicinity of McCooks Gardens. A female passenger exited the bus and alerted the police officers of a robbery in progress and pointed out two men to officers. The men ran along a dirt road known as 'Bottom Lane' and the police gave chase. On reaching the end of Bottom Lane, the men opened gunfire at the police who returned the fire and a shoot-out ensued. One man was hit and the other escaped. A 9mm pistol with 9 live rounds was recovered from the injured man. The injured man was taken to Spanish Town Hospital where he was pronounced dead on arrival. The deceased man who was unidentified at the time, was searched by the police and three cellular phones, a wallet and a gold bracelet were found in his pants pocket. There is no evidence to contradict the police account.	The Commission respectfully recommends that: a) No criminal charges be laid or disciplinary action be taken in relation to the fatal shooting of Jermaine Brown. b) The file be forwarded to the Special Coroner. 4	Death in Custody	John Williams	Mr. Williams was housed in the infirmary section of the Dormitory, which is located on the second floor of the Medical Centre. The room that housed Mr. Williams was void of any beds and most of the inmates were elderly. The Commission was informed that all the inmates housed in that section was either confirmed or suspected to have Covid-19. Mr. Williams was tested for COVID-19 on September 20, 2021 after he was pronounced dead by Dr. The Doctor. indicated in her notes that the possible cause of death was possibly COVID-19 as the inmate was in close contact with several confirmed cases.	The Commission respectfully recommends that: a) No criminal charges be laid or disciplinary action be taken against any member of the Department of Correctional Services in relation to death of John Williams. b) The file be forwarded to the Special Coroner. 5	Fatal Shooting	Brandon Campbell	On Tuesday, January 2, 2018 at about 7:50 a.m. a team of police officers were on Flag March and inquiries in St Andrew South when information was received that a group of men were seen with high powered firearms at Crescent Road, Kingston 13. When the police arrived on the scene they were greeted with gunfire. The police returned the fire and a man was found suffering from what appeared to be gunshot wounds. His driver's license revealed that he is Brandon Campbell. He was rushed to the Kingston Public Hospital where he was pronounced dead.	The Commission respectfully recommends that: a) No criminal charges be laid or disciplinary action be taken in relation to the fatal shooting of Brandon Campbell. b) The file be forwarded to the Special Coroner. 6	Fatal Shooting	Andrew Chambers	On Sunday, December 20, 2020 the police received information that armed men were at a shop in the community of Greenvale. The officers after waiting on additional support went to the location and observed one of the men passing an object to another, upon seeing the police the man ran. One of the men had a bulge in his waist; the officer went to prevent the man from reaching for the bulge. The man then wrestled the officer's M16 Rifle out of his hand, the officer then grabbed the assailant pulled his secondary weapon and discharge two rounds causing injury to himself and the victim. The victim was taken to the hospital where he was pronounced dead. There are no independent eyewitnesses in this matter.	The Commission respectfully recommends that: a) No criminal charges be laid or disciplinary action be taken in relation to the fatal shooting of Andrew Chambers. b) The file be forwarded to the Special Coroner. 7	Fatality	Romaine Frazer	It was reported to the Commission on June 25, 2014 by the May Pen Police Re: The murder of Romaine Fraser: It is alleged that his body was discovered on the 23.7.2013 about 5:56 a.m. along the Bustamante Highway, in the vicinity of the May Pen Junk Yard by citizens who summoned the police. On arrival of the police the body was seen lying on its side in a pool blood with what appeared to be gunshot wounds to the head. The scene was processed by Special Constable of Area III T.S.D where four 9mm spent shell casings were recovered. The body was taken to the May Pen Hospital where it was confirmed dead by Dr. then removed to the Witter and Sons Funeral Home to await Post Mortem. On the 23.11. 2013 one TM was taken into custody and interviewed. During the interview session he gave a statement in which he mentioned the name of a man known only to him as J or B whom he knew as a police officer, who he alleged took Fraser away in a car on the 22.07.2013 sometime after 11 p.m. From what has been garnered in this investigation, it cannot be concluded that the shooting of Romaine Fraser was at the hands of the Constable and as such it will be difficult to be proved.	The Commission respectfully recommends that: a) No criminal charges be laid or disciplinary action be taken in relation to the fatal shooting of Romaine Fraser. b) The file be forwarded to the Special Coroner. 8	Threat	JG o.b.o. LP	JG, sister of virtual complainant LP, reported on December 14, 2021 that the police has been harassing her brother for many months. According to her the most recent visit was on December 13, 2021 when the police demanded the firearm that he reportedly had. He informed the officers that he did not have a gun and his house was thereafter searched and he was taken into custody. JG indicated that the following threatening statements were made by the police to LP – “his clock a tick” and that “they know where he takes out his goat and what time he goes to the bush and comes back in.”	The file is closed as the complainant is unwilling to proceed with the matter. It is hereby recommended that no criminal charges be laid or disciplinary action taken against any member of the Jamaica Constabulary Force in respect of this complaint.	No Charge
9	Assault	AP	On Monday, December 27, 2021, about 11:00 a.m. Remandee AP, had just finished having a bath and was instructed by an officer to exit the bathroom. Whilst exiting the bathroom, the officer struck him on his left ear and it resulted in him feeling pain on the left ear. He was later escorted to the medical area by Staff Officer, where he was treated by medical orderly Correctional Officer1 (CO1).	The file is closed as the complainant is unwilling to proceed with the matter. It is hereby recommended that no criminal charges be laid or disciplinary action taken against member of the Department of Correctional services in respect of this complaint.	No Charge
10	Assault	AL	On February 1, 2022, a report was received from the DCS that two inmates were involved in an altercation. Based on the reports, allegedly there was a fight between KA and AL on December 27, 2021. Correctional Officers intervened which led to AL being relocated to another dormitory. Acting Staff Officer facilitated this relocation which led to AL’s refusal and subsequently being struck once with a baton. To date, AL has refused to give a statement to both Correctional Staff at Tamarind Farm Adult Correctional Centre and INDECOM.	The file is closed as the complainant is unwilling to proceed with the matter. 12	Assault	EC	The complainant, EC alleges that on Saturday April 27, 2013 he was physically assaulted by a police officer in the vicinity of the Trinity Church, Westgate, Montego Bay. He also said that he was addressed by the said police officer in an unprofessional manner.	The complainant is unwilling to continue the matter. It is hereby recommended that no criminal charges be laid or disciplinary action taken against any member of Jamaica Constabulary Force in respect of this complaint.	No Charge
13	Neglect of Duty	DB	The complainant, DB is alleging that on Constable neglected to perform his duty by failing to put a case of Assault and Threat he reported on March 21, 2015 against his brother, IB, before the courts. Having investigated the matter, the Commission has found that the allegation of neglect of duty has not been made out. 14	Conduct Unbecoming	DM	The complainant, DM is alleging that Woman Constable brought trumped out charges against him arising from a confrontation they had at the Rubis Gas Station in Savanna-la-Mar on June 7, 2016. Having investigated the matter and found insufficient evidence to ground a charge or support disciplinary proceedings, the Commission recommends no criminal charges be laid nor disciplinary action be taken. 15	Assault	SN	The complainant alleged that the police used his hand to cause a dent on the left rear quarter of her car on Monday 17th day of October 2016 at about 7:30 a.m. at her home. On Monday, 17th day of October 2016, at approximately 7:30 a.m. the complainant stated that she was at her home sleeping when she was awakened by a loud noise on her roof. When she went outside to look what was happening she saw her son WR arguing with their neighbor who is the family of the policeman. Shortly after her son WR came down off the roof with a machete in his hand and blood coming from his hand. She told him to go to the Hundred man police station to make a report, which he did immediately. At approximately 7:55 a.m. shortly after WR had left for the Police Station, the complainant alleged that the policeman went to her veranda in rage, pointing his finger at her saying "mi ago kill yuh son". He then used his hand to hit her car causing a dent to the left rear quarter. She also alleged that after the policeman left, his sisters N and A attacked her, hit her in her back causing her to fall on the ground, she then received several blows in her upper back.	The Commission hereby recommends that no criminal charges be laid nor disciplinary action be taken.	No Charge
16	Assault	SD	The complainant, SD is alleging that on May 5, 2012, she was assaulted by Constable at the Sandy Bay Police Station. Having investigated the matter and found that no rational and properly directed jury would convict the concerned officer of assault, the Commission’s recommendation is that no criminal charges be laid nor disciplinary action be taken.	The Commission hereby recommends that no criminal charges be laid nor disciplinary action be taken in respect of this complaint.	No Charge
17	Assault	SB	The complainant, SB is alleging that on October 25, 2016, he was struck on his right hand with a baton by District Constable while he was in custody at the Black River Police Station. He sustained a broken index metacarpal bone as a result of the strike. Having investigated the matter and found there is no prima facie case realistically likely to lead to a criminal conviction, the Commission recommends that no criminal charges be laid nor disciplinary action be taken. 18	Assault	SB and DE	The complainants are alleging that on February 11, 2012, they were kidnapped and assaulted along a gully bank in Waterhouse, St. Andrew by police officers as reprisal for an assault allegedly perpetrated by DE on a female officer on February 8, 2012. Having investigated this matter and found that the absence of cogent identification would militate against the prospects of conviction, the Commission recommends that no criminal charges be laid nor disciplinary action be taken. 19	Conduct Unbecoming	SNM	The complainant, SNM is alleging that on March 19, 2012, she was subjected to a humiliating search at the Norman Manley International Airport by Woman Corporal. Having investigated the matter and found no evidence of criminal conduct or conduct unbecoming by a member of the Jamaica Constabulary Force, the Commission recommends that no criminal charges be laid nor disciplinary action be taken. 20	Assault	AG	The complainant, AG is alleging that on September 6, 2016, he was assaulted by Detective Corporal at the place of work along Roosevelt Avenue, Montego Bay in the parish of St. James. Medical evidence, forensic evidence and witness evidence cumulatively confirm that an assault without lawful justification or excuse was perpetrated against the complainant's person that day but, due to his and the witnesses' unwillingness to participate in an identification parade and resultant court proceedings, the Commission was unable to resolve this complaint by criminal prosecution. In light of the complications arising from the lack of cogent identification and witness lack of co-operation, the Commission recommends that no criminal charges be laid nor disciplinary action be taken.	The Commission hereby recommends that no criminal charges be laid nor disciplinary action be taken in respect of this complaint.	No Charge
21	Shooting Injury	WW	On Thursday, July 4, 2019 the complainant WW was riding his bike through the town of Christiana when he heard a loud explosions sounding to him like a car muffler backfiring. He continued riding heading towards his work base in Brockery when he saw some men running towards him and eventually ran past him. Following behind these men were two (2) police officers, one in khaki uniform and the other in a red seam uniform. He saw the officer in khaki running with a gun pointed in his direction, and he then jumped off his motorcycle and while doing so he heard more loud explosions and felt a burning sensation to his buttocks. Upon using his hand to examine the area where he felt the burning, he saw blood on his hand, and he realised he had been shot. He was subsequently assisted by the police to the Percy Junor Hospital where he was treated for his injury and released. The police report that on Thursday, July 4, 2019 they responded to information concerning a white Honda Civic motorcar with four men aboard in the town of Christiana. The police accosted three (3) men seen inside the said white Honda Civic motorcar and escorted them and the vehicle to the Christiana Police Station. Subsequent information received concerning the fourth man caused the police to go on a covert operation where they boarded the said Honda motorcar with one of the men accosted placed in the front seat, and drove the vehicle into the town centre. While there a man fitting the description of the fourth man, walked up to the vehicle and attempted to open the door, he was then instructed to stop by the police. This man pulled a firearm and opened fire at the police and ran off. The police returned fire and chased the man who continued to shoot at them. He was chased to a lane behind a plaza where he managed to elude the police by jumping over a retaining wall and running into nearby bushes. A search was conducted for him but only the articles of clothing matching what he had been seen in were found. The police were later advised that a civilian was shot and injured in the buttocks consequent to the shooting.	It is hereby recommended that no criminal charges be laid, or disciplinary action be taken and that the file be closed.	No Charge
22	Assault	DD	The complainant, DD was an inmate at the Tower Street Adult Correctional Centre (TSACC) when on January 4, 2021, after an incident with him an another inmate working as an Orderly, at the grills of block F-North resulting in injury, he was being escorted by a Correctional Officer from the Medical Centre at the TSACC when upon nearing his cell block he looked at the corner of his eye and saw the Correctional Officer raise his hand with a baton in it and he suddenly blacked out. He regained consciousness and found himself on a Ward at the Kingston Public Hospital with a bandage to the right side of his forehead. The Correctional Officer (CO) reports he was tasked with escorting inmate DD to the Medical Centre following an altercation with another inmate that caused injury to inmate DD's head. On his return he was thereafter tasked with escorting inmate DD to his cells to facilitate him being relocated. The CO states he was walking with inmate DD ahead of him when he saw inmate RS pass them. He then saw inmate DD proceed to attack inmate RS, hitting him with his fists. He then grabbed on the inmate DD's shirt to restrain him from attacking inmate RS, when inmate DD attempted to attack him also, by trying to punch him. He then used his baton to strike inmate DD to prevent further attack. Inmate DD was injured as a result.	The Commission respectfully recommends that no criminal charges be laid, or disciplinary action be taken against Correctional Officer 1 , but that he be exposed to re-training as it relates to the use of the baton, and the file be closed. 23	Shooting Injury	MW	On Thursday, March 4, 2021 the complainant, MW was walking through his community of Homestead off the Old Harbour Road in Spanish Town, St. Catherine at approximately 7am making his way to get breakfast, when he heard several loud explosions coming from across Old Harbour Road. He then saw four (4) men dressed in dark blue uniforms all wearing masks and carrying long guns. The men ran in his direction and he heard more loud explosions like gunshots and he ran off towards Spencer Lane, when he felt a burning sensation to his left side. He looked down to his side and saw blood coming from his side and realised he was shot. He managed to get to the main road, where he saw a white Toyota Hiace bus, that he stopped and requested assistance in getting to the hospital. He was taken to the Spanish Town Hospital where he was treated and admitted. The police report that they were responding to an assignment from Police emergency concerning reports of gunshots being fired in Homestead off Old Harbour Road, Spanish Town, St. Catherine. On arrival in the area at about 6:30am, they made enquiries of some persons gathered in the area and during this task, they heard several loud explosions sounding like gunshots coming from an area across from them. They went in the direction of the explosions of foot and travelled to a dirt track with zinc fencing. The police report they did not find anything upon conducting a search of the area, and they did not discharge their weapons at any time during this search.	It is hereby recommended that no criminal charges be laid, or disciplinary action be taken and that the file be closed.	No Charge

24	Assault	KA	<p>On Monday, July 25, 2016 the complainant KA, who was an inmate at the Tower Street Adult Correctional Centre (TSACC) was standing at the entrance of his cell with another inmate, AP attempting to use a cellular phone to send a text message to the sister of AP. While doing so, AP alerted KA that the Correctional Officers were patrolling. KA states the Correctional Officer requested he hand over the cellular phone, but he did not do so. Instead, KA placed the cellular phone in the back section of his underpants and retreated into his cell. The Correctional Officer held on to him and tried to pull him outside of the cell, and KA managed to close the cell grill. The Officer let KA go and KA ran from his cell with the cellular phone down the corridor in an attempt to give the cellular phone to another inmate. KA states the Correctional Officer chased him and began to hit him on his shoulder and back with the baton. KA ran to the bathroom section of the block and it was then that he felt more blows to his body and saw three (3) more Correctional Officers with batons hitting him. He states he managed to give the cellular phone to another inmate, and while this was happening, an Overseer passed and instructed the Correctional Officers to stop hitting KA, and they did. KA was escorted to the Medical Centre of the TSACC and was treated. Subsequently he was referred to the Kingston Public Hospital (KPH) where he was examined and treated. The Correctional Officer reports that during a routine security patrol inmate KA was seen with a cellular phone and instructed to hand it over to the officer. KA did not do so although repeatedly asked to do so. KA was accosted but he retreated into his cell causing the Correctional Officer to step into his cell. The officer blew his whistle and pushed up the gate to the cell. KA then pushed the cell door open causing it to hit the officer, and ran towards the bathroom area. The correctional Officer gave chase and managed to get to KA who still refused to hand over the cellular phone. KA was accosted however he then pushed the officer and attempted to punch him when the officer pulled his regulation baton and struck KA twice across his shoulder. KA passed the cellular phone to another inmate, and this phone was later retrieved. KA was escorted to the Overseer's office and enquiries made of him.</p>	<p>The Commission respectfully recommends that no criminal charges be laid, or disciplinary action be taken and the file closed.</p>	No Charge
25	Shooting Injury	RB	<p>The complainant, RB was walking towards the bus stop in the community of Naggo Head, in St. Catherine on Tuesday, April 24, 2012, when he had a disagreement with a policeman known to him as 'S'. He continued on his way with 'S' walking behind him and cursing at him, but he ignored him and proceeded to speak on his cellular phone with his boss. Upon nearing a betting shop heading towards the bus stop, 'S' used a firearm to hit the complainant to the neck and he lost consciousness. When RB regained consciousness he was at the hospital where he was told he was shot in the neck, and he received treatment to the wound at his neck. The police indicate that on the day of the incident, RB o/c Ki Ki entered a wholesale and asked the concerned officer, District Constable to buy him a Pepsi Bubbla, but he ignored RB. RB then began to hurl insults and use expletives to curse at D/C. The complainant continued to verbally abuse the officer and made the officer's children uncomfortable. The complainant followed the officer until the officer came to a betting shop where he become frustrated with the abuse, and informed the complainant that he would arrest him for using abusive and calumnious language and indecent language, and laid hold of him to effect an arrest. While doing so, a struggle ensued and both men fell to the ground, the complainant falling on top of the officer. The complainant allegedly pulled a black handle kitchen knife from his waist and stabbed at the officer repeatedly, threatening to kill him, and the officer instructed him several times to stop, and tried to push him off of him. The officer became fearful and reached for his service revolver and fired one shot in the direction of the complainant who fell and dropped the knife. The officer retrieved the knife, and hid as he was being stoned by some civilians. The officer called the police and advised them of what transpired, and was later transported to the Greater Portmore Police Station.</p>	<p>It is hereby recommended that no criminal charges be laid, or disciplinary action be taken and that the file be closed. It is however, open to the complainant to pursue civil remedies.</p>	No Charge
26	Assault Unlawful Wounding	CG	<p>The complainant, CG attended upon the Rockfort Police Station on Monday, August 8, 2016 to report on condition of her bail. Upon entering the station she was told she was wanted for arrest regarding an offence committed by her on July 27, 2016 on a police officer. She was subsequently locked inside the Guardroom and was subsequently beaten by male police officers who insisted that she was to be placed in the Holding area as she had committed an offence. She was beaten all over her body and this resulted in her receiving a wound and subsequently a fracture to her left leg. She was forcibly handcuffed and placed in the Holding area on the ground. Her sister was later summoned and she was taken to the Kingston Public Hospital (KPH) where she received treatment, and was later admitted, treated and released. The police report that CG attended upon the Rockfort Police Station to report on condition of bail, and it was observed that she failed to report on two occasions in the previous week, as she is ordered to report on Mondays and Wednesdays. CG was questioned in relation to her failure to report, and she remained silent. A search of the Station Diary revealed that she had committed an offence against a Police officer on July 27, 2016, and was informed of same and told she would be arrested. She began to behave boisterously and refused to enter the Holding area. Assistance was sought to arrest CG and she continued to behave boisterously while using indented language to curse at the police. She threw herself to the ground and continued her boisterous behaving, refusing to be arrested and escorted to the Holding area. She then kick one of the officers who was providing assistance, and as such he struck her with the baton, after which she escaped his grasp and continued to shout and curse. She was subsequently taken into the Holding area and handcuffed there. She was later arrested and charged for Resisting Arrest, Assaulting a Police officer and Using Abusive and Calumnious language. She was bailed and subsequently taken to the KPH by her sister for treatment.</p>	<p>The Commission respectfully recommends that no criminal charges be laid, or disciplinary action be taken concerning the allegations of the complainant and the file be closed.</p>	No Charge
